



Dr. Jaspal Kaur Dhanju is Dean Research and Professor-Incharge Maharana Pratap Chair and Former Head of Department. She did her B.A., M.A. (History) and Ph.D. from M.S. University, Baroda. She has more than 30 years of teaching, research and academic experience. Her areas of interest include the history of Pre-Modern/Modern India and Punjab, Post Modernism and Gender Studies. She has two books to her credit (i) *Economy and Society of North Gujarat with special reference to Kheda District, (1750-1850)* and (ii) *History and Post Modernism*. She has more than 40 research papers published in various national and international journals of repute. She has remained the editor of *Proceedings of South Asian History Conference* published by the Department of History.

She has delivered about eight extension lectures and also acted as resource person in orientation and refresher courses of Punjabi University and universities of the neighbouring region. She has delivered keynote addresses and also chaired sessions in various seminars from time to time.
